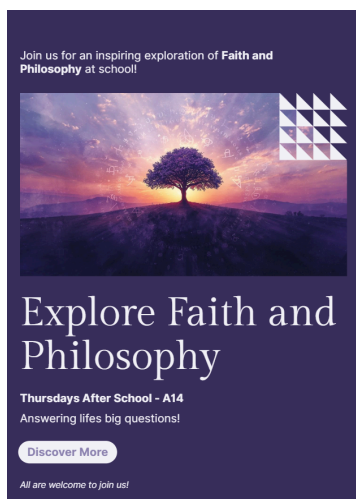
## New Website

## Families Focus Group (FFG) - Wednesday 22 October 2025

Thank you to everyone who joined our recent FFG meeting. We had a really positive discussion about how we can strengthen communication and engagement across our school community. Parents found the *Together We Achieve* booklet very useful for planning ahead, and there was enthusiasm about the planned events later in the academic year. We also talked about offering short online or video sessions to help parents understand how best to support learning in each subject, and encouraging students and parents to attend key events together, following the success of the Year 11 model. Suggestions included starting information evenings a little later, providing more context about why they're important, and sharing a clear calendar of family and information events for each year group. We'll also look at using MCAS and emails (rather than attachments) to share updates more effectively. Finally, there was interest in exploring the idea of setting up a PTA to build an even stronger sense of community.

The group then discussed independent learning and feedback on the implementation of the school's new policy. The general consensus was that the frequency and quality of homework was much improved this academic year particularly in maths and science but there was still some work to be done to fully embed processes. It was also noted that the amount of homework being set at KS4 was about right but more is required at KS3.

## Medication, Illness and Vaccines

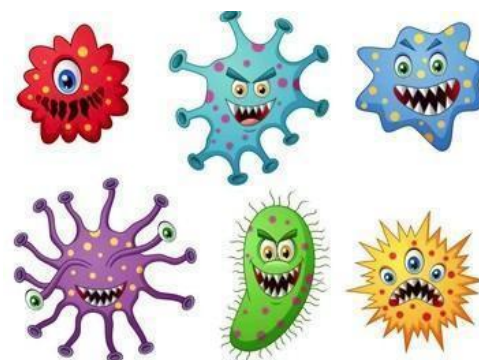
### NHS Guidelines

In addition, should your child's medical condition change (i.e., they no longer need to use their inhaler) please contact their community team.

We will continue to provide the support and medical assistance you have already agreed to unless we hear from you.

## A.I For Multi-Lingual Families

**Using A.I to Enhance Accessibility and Communication For Multi-Lingual Families**

- Use to translate normative communication, for example everyday letters and correspondence, such as notification of non-school uniform days or nits in the class!
- Use to adjust simple extended text formats, such as letters or generic support guides. Language can be chunked, dual-coded (visuals added), and transformed to accommodate literacy levels of the audience. Then translated too!
- Can offer live translation (including text to speech, speech to text, and combined) options that could support informal conversations such as at drop off, pick up or reception support. This can be an effective way to **start** conversations.

Culturally competent relational practice which prioritises psychological and physical safety, and accessibility, should be felt and experienced by all community members. Please ask your Advisory Teacher for further support or information.

- Not to be used in sensitive, confidential or complex scenarios (for example safeguarding). Relational practice is paramount and for the wellbeing of all involved such topic/agendas should be navigated carefully.
- Jargon is rarely translated effectively or with integrity of meaning. Where such language cannot be avoided, or where loaded terminology will be used, human interpreters should be utilised.
- Language proficiency varies significantly from language to language. Gaps in efficiency and accuracy will greatly undermine the understanding of all involved. Coproduction can only be achieved with all fully informed and acting with agency.
- A.I cannot replicate the human nature and experience of education and relationships. It cannot authentically develop interpersonal skills that interpreters/advocates can.

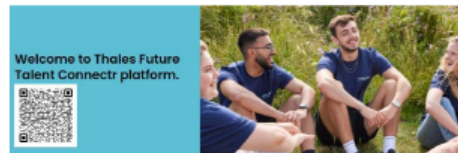
