Dear Families

We wanted to write to all of you who have children in our Year 13 economics groups to fully recognise that your child has experienced some disruption in staffing across the course. We know this is far from ideal and have been working hard to support students as best we can during this time.

Following the recent Year 13 economics mock examinations, we would like to outline the steps we are taking to support students in the final months before their A Level examinations. We are fully committed to ensuring that all students are receiving consistent support, clear guidance and targeted revision to help them achieve the best possible outcomes in the summer.

Over the coming weeks, the following support measures are being put in place:

### 1. Weekly Recap Programme (Theme 4)

We have begun a structured weekly recap programme, starting with Theme 4, to consolidate key knowledge and address common gaps identified in the mock examinations.

### 2. Structured Lessons Focused on Exam Skills

Every lesson moving forward will continue to include:

- Content recap
- Exam skills development
- Detailed feedback on exam technique and past paper questions

This will ensure students are continuously applying their knowledge in an exam-focused way.

### 3. Online Video Support

Students have been directed to high-quality revision platforms to reinforce learning outside the classroom:

- EconDal video resources
- Tutor2u revision videos
- E-Revision targeted activities matched to specific topics





These resources allow students to revisit explanations and strengthen understanding independently.

#### 4. Easter Revision Programme

During the Easter period students will complete:

- Timed exam papers for homework

On return students will be sitting a paper 3 mock examination on Tuesday 28 April 2026.

This will provide an additional opportunity to practise full exam papers under timed conditions and receive feedback before the final exams.

#### 5. Student Companion Guides

All students have been provided with Tutor2U student companion guides, which offer clear summaries, exam practice and structured revision support.

#### 6. Additional Revision Resources

We have purchased a Tutor2U economics diagram workbook for each student, which is a helpful resource for mastering key diagrams often required in A Level exams.

#### 7. After-school intervention sessions

These will take place on Wednesdays and Thursdays after school until 3.45pm all the way up until the exams.

#### 8. Economics Revision Conference

We are also organising an economics revision conference, for all day on Wednesday 22 April 2026 which will provide students with additional expert exam preparation and exam technique guidance. Further details of this will follow. As a school we will cover the cost of entry and students will just need to cover their travel expenses.

#### 9. University Contextual Information

As an additional supportive measure, the school has ensured that contextual information regarding the disruption to teaching continuity has been communicated within UCAS references where appropriate. This allows universities to understand the context in which this cohort has completed their studies should it be relevant when considering applications.

Our priority as always is to ensure that students feel supported, confident and well prepared as they approach their final examinations. We will continue to monitor progress closely and provide additional guidance where needed.
